



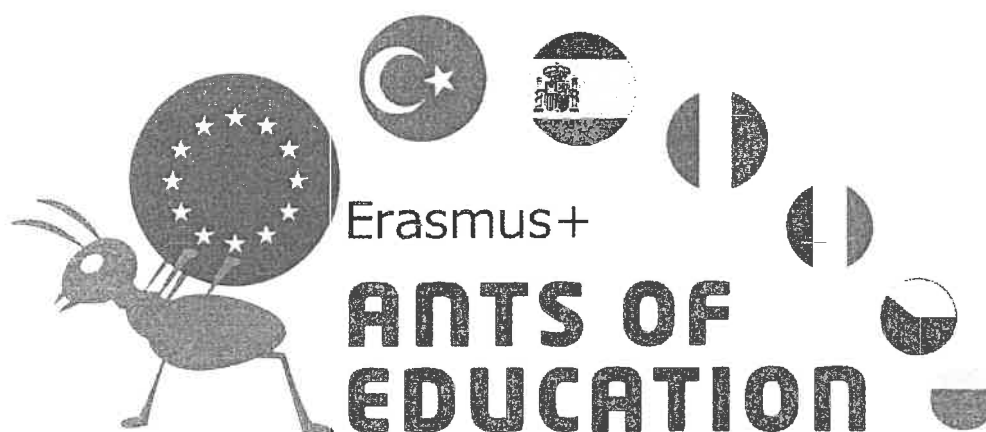

ANTS OF EDUCATION - PROJECT MEETING MONTROUGE

11 – 18 DECEMBER 2019



MEETING REPORT



The 4th mobility of the Erasmus+ project “Ants of Education” was held between 11th and 18th December 2019 in Montrouge, France.

The organizer of the 4th mobility was the French “Lycée Maurice Genevoix,,

The Italian delegation from the “Istituto d'Istruzione Superiore Margherita Hack,, arrived in Montrouge on 11th December and departed on 18th December 2019. The delegation was composed of Ms Rosaria Corica and Ms Melissa Lattanzio and the students Mr Jacopo Orsini, Miss Giada Colaiuda, Miss Caterina Micozzi and Miss Beatrice Roncacci.

The Spanish delegation from the “Centro San Viator”, arrived in Montrouge on 11th December and departed on 18th December 2019. The delegation was composed of Ms Ane Ruiloba Perez and Ms Amaya Carrero and the students Miss Haizea Garcia, Miss Aissa Perez, Miss Maren Garcia.

The Lithuanian delegation from the “Kauno buitinių paslaugų ir verslo mokykla”, arrived in Montrouge on 11th December and departed on 18th December 2019. The delegation was composed of Ms Vaiva Daugvilaitė, and the students Miss Gabija Bukauskaitė, Miss Orinta Vaitkevičiūtė, Miss Ieva Vilkauskaitė and Miss Samanta Kavaliauskaitė.

The Turkish delegation from “Özel Güney Fen Bilimleri Anadolu Lisesi” in Antalya arrived in Montrouge on 11th December and departed on 18th December 2019. The delegation was composed of Mr Tuncay Savtak, Mr Birol Orak and the students Miss Dilek Ceren Ozyildirim, Miss Sude Erden and Miss İlayda Arıkan.

The Czech delegation from “Střední odborná škola ochrany osob a majetku s.r.o.” in Karviná arrived in Montrouge on 11th December and departed on 18th December 2019. The delegation was composed of Ms Slavka Krystová Florková, Ms Radoslava Janteková, Mr Michal Florek and the students Miss Anna Burkotová, Mr Radek Šanta, Mr Alexandr Wiglasz, Mr David Vosáhlo and Mr. Ondřej Štefánik.

On Wednesday 11th December 2019, all the participants were welcomed by the French coordinator of the project at the hotel. All the teams came by private bus to the hotel, where the host families met their guest pupils and where the teachers had their rooms booked. On the departure day, all the teams were transferred to the airport by private bus.

On Thursday 12th December 2019, the French coordinator met all the teachers at the hotel and led them to school. All the partners were welcomed by the school administration in the school theatre. Afterwards, the partners went to the room dedicated to the Erasmus+ project to present their schools and the French team presented their school system. Later all the partners were guided to see the school. In the afternoon the partners worked on Multilingual dictionary and after that they discussed about the film “To Sir with love”. The evening was free. The students went home with their hosts and teachers went to the hotel.

On Friday 13th December 2019 the partners met at school at 9:00 am and Ms. Bellagha welcomed the first group of students for the Escape game: “Mission: Impossible, Fallout. Will you be able to save Paris?”. Meanwhile the second group of students was attending a class. At 10:00 am the groups switched. After the second group finished the Escape game all the partners gathered in the room dedicated to Erasmus+ project for the “Cuisine day”. The partners exchanged and shared specialities from their own countries. In the afternoon all the partners walked to the Latin Quarter and visited it, in particular Notre-Dame. After having some free time the partners came back by underground around 5:00 pm. In the evening all the teachers had dinner together in the restaurant in front of the Town Hall.

On Saturday 14th December the partners met at school at 8:30 am and the Czech team presented its survey on “ESL, violence and bullying, lack of literacy,, in their country. Later the teams moved to room 0003 Ms Nora Fraisse, founder of Marion Mains Tendues arrived and made a presentation about “ESL, violence and bullying, lack of literacy,,. Later the other teams gave presentations on “ESL, violence and bullying, lack of literacy,,. Students and teachers had lunch on their own and in the afternoon all the partners visited Montmartre and Sacre Coeur and came back to Montrouge by underground. The rest of the day was free.

On Sunday 15th December all the partners met at 9:30 am at the bus station at Portes d'Orléans to go to visit “Quai de Branly Museum”. After the visit all the members had packed lunch around 1:00 pm and then by Batobus to get to Louvre and visited the site. Then all the partners went back by Batobus to Eiffel Tower and went to the top.

On Monday 16th December teachers had meeting while the students attended the classes. Then all the partners moved to the school yard for the Project Garden, followed by the students' presentations about Music and Dances. All the partners had lunch at the school canteen and in the afternoon they went sightseeing in Paris. At 6:30 pm the partners were welcomed by the Mayor of Montrouge Étienne Lengereau. Because of the general strike in Paris the excursions to Champs Elysees and Arc de Triomphe and Galeries Lafayette had to be cancelled.

On Tuesday 17th December because of the general strike in Paris the excursion to the Chateaux de Versailles had to be cancelled. The teachers had meeting at 9:00 am to finalize the project, discuss the matters for the next project in Spain and write the report. In the evening, before the closing ceremony and the releasing of the attendance certificates, the results of "ESL, violence and bullying, lack of literacy,, survey were presented by the French school.

During the 4st mobility the teachers agreed on the tasks to be done for the 5th exchange in Spain which will be held between 6th February 2020 (arrival) and 13th February 2020 (departure).

The delegations also agreed on the following:


- Each partner school will make the dissemination of the 4th project meeting and it is recommended to publish their results of work on their school web pages or school facebook pages, in the local media etc. and will send the outputs both to the coordinator and the other responsible teachers so that they could upload them into the project webpage, project facebook page, etwinning page etc.
- Each country will prepare some national dishes that will be presented at the National Cuisine Day in the school in Spain.
- Each country will prepare a short presentation of their country, town and school to be presented during the mobility in Spain. (5 min. maximum).
- Each country will prepare digital presentation about "War and People" and "Intercultural Learning, similarities and differences in education in partner countries".
- All the participants will watch the film "Dead Poets Society" before the mobility in Spain.
- Each country will bring some seeds / plants to help to organize the Project Garden in Spain.
- The Spanish team will prepare a survey on "Intercultural Learning" and will send it to the partner schools by 7th January. Each school will then carry out the survey with 30-50 students and send the results to the host school by 18th January.
- All participating schools will send their newsletters by 18th January 2020 to the Turkish school. Maximum pages of each newsletter will be 4 pages per school. The participating schools should use word (Times New Roman-12) format and picasa for their photos and not more than 1 MB (1000 KB).
- The French school will keep maintaining the project eTwinning pages so that the visitors could see the results of our work. All partners will help to run this page.
- The participating schools are asked to send their name lists by January 10th (together with ages, genders and email addresses). Then, the Spanish school will send the other partners the programme of the 5th mobility and the host families contacts by 20th.
- The Czech school will upload the results of the work (presentations, surveys etc.) on the website.

- The Italian school will organize the Europass and multilingual dictionary. Each partners should complete their part of multilingual dictionaires and upload on the etwinning platform until 24th January 2020. For the Europass, each partner school will fill in their Europasses on their own and bring to the 5th meeting in Spain so that the host school could sign them at the end of the project meeting.
- The Lithuanian school will maintain the Facebook page and hold Skype/eTwinning conference. The exact date for Skype/eTwinning conference was agreed to be at 12:40 pm CET on 29th January 2020.
- The Spanish school will work out the brochures, photo and video-presentation (a DVD; "Memorials of the project / Products exhibition" for each partner) from the meeting in the France to be presented at the meeting in Spain.
- The dates of the fifth meeting in Spain is 6th February 2020 (arrival) and 13th February 2020 (departure).
- All schools will continually carry on with local activities of the project according to the tasks.
- All schools will evaluate the budget of their schools and check the budget matters.

All the participants of the "Ants of Education" project appreciate the effort, the work and the warm hospitality of the French organizers of the 4th mobility. All the participants find the activities very interesting and agree that they have learned a lot during the meeting. All the planned tasks and activities were fully accomplished.


The next meeting is going to be held in Spain between 6th February 2020 and 13th February 2020.
